## **Purpose of the Course**

This is an undergraduate seminar in qualitative research methods. We will learn to use three methods of collecting data: in-depth interviews, participant observation and focus groups. The reading (7 books in all) is a combination of works on the research methods themselves and other books that exemplify the use of these methods. For those interested in Latin America, the course will help prepare you for doing field research there. For those doing graduate work, you can register for the course as a graduate seminar and do additional work.

#### Requirements

You are expected to do all of the required reading and attend class. You will also do two research assignments, one solo and one in a group. Your group research assignment will be a focus group.

### **Grading:**

60% of your grade is based upon your research assignments, upon class attendance, and upon participation. You will have only one exam, a final exam, which is worth 40% of your grade.
