Course Description: Sequences, geometric and Taylor series; systems of linear equations, Gaussian elimination, matrices, determinants and vectors; partial differentiation, multiple integrals; applications to marginal analysis, least-squares and Lagrange multipliers.

Prerequisites: MAC 2233 with minimum grade of C, or the equivalent.

Required Materials:

1. *WebAssign:* WebAssign gives you online access to the book, homework, and quizzes. You can purchase access to WebAssign using one of the following two methods.
 - a. UF All Access
 - b. At the UF Bookstore, which also includes an optional print version of the customized textbook. The cheapest option is to purchase access through UF All Access. More information about UF All Access and WebAssign can be found on the Canvas home page.
2. *Top Hat:* Top Hat allows you to participate in class by answering questions using an appropriate digital device (laptop, cell phone, tablet, etc). More information about Top Hat can be found on the Canvas home page.

Grades: Your course grade is based on the following: three semester exams worth 50%, a final exam worth 20%, quizzes worth 10%, homework worth 10%, and class participation based on Top Hat points worth 10% of your final grade. We will use the following scale:

You will be given exactly one week once an assignment has been graded to notify Dr. Nikin-Beers about an incorrectly added total, an incorrectly entered or missing grade, or any similar issue. After the one week time period, all grades are final.

Homework: Homework assignments will be assigned regularly through WebAssign. Automatic extensions for WebAssign will be enabled with a small penalty on unearned questions up to 48 hours after the due date. No credit will be given for questions submitted after this 48 hour time period beyond the due date. At least two homework assignments will be dropped.

Quizzes: Quizzes will be assigned periodically through WebAssign, and are usually timed. There will be no makeups or extensions for missed quizzes; however, at least one quiz grade will be dropped.

Exams: There will be three semester exams given from **8:20-10:10 pm** on the following dates: **Tuesday February 11**, **Tuesday March 17**, and **Tuesday April 7**. Locations for these exams will be announced on Canvas. Notify Dr. Nikin-Beers as soon as possible if you have a conflicting assembly exam.

Final Exam: The final exam will be given **Monday April 27 from 5:30-7:30 pm**. The location will be announced on Canvas. The final exam is mandatory and comprehensive. Your final exam score will be used to replace your lowest exam score, if the final exam score is higher.

Makeup Exams: In general, makeup exams will not be given. However, makeup exams will be given with appropriate documentation under certain circumstances, in accordance with UF policy found at <https://catalog.ufl.edu/UGRD/academic-regulations/attendance-policies/>. If you have a known documented conflict with an exam, you must notify Dr. Nikin-Beers and present your documentation at least ONE WEEK PRIOR to the exam. If illness or other extenuating circumstances cause you to miss an exam, contact Dr. Nikin-Beers immediately (no later than 24 hours after the exam) by email. In order to take a makeup exam, you still must present some appropriate documentation to Dr. Nikin-Beers even if illness or other extenuating circumstances cause you to miss an exam.

Class Participation: All students are required to purchase access to Top Hat. Starting approximately the second week of the semester, students will be required to have an appropriate digital device in class in order to participate in lectures. Students will be asked questions and their responses will be graded and recorded. Each Top Hat question will be worth three points, except on review days, when the total number of Top Hat questions will be worth six points. There will be no makeups for missed Top Hat questions; however, at least twelve points will be dropped. A student is not allowed to respond in class using any device but his or her own; a violation of this policy is considered cheating and will be handled according to standard University policies.
