I am a linguist. My research focus is on syntax, pragmatics, and their interfaces. I have done work on raising, control, and resumption in Standard and Lebanese Arabic and in South Asian languages. I have worked on the syntax and pragmatics of unselected datives – or what I call Attitude Datives – in Lebanese Arabic and neighboring varieties. I am also interested in the phonology/prosodic morphology of Arabic.
