Grades: A student's grade will be based upon class participation points (clickers), online homework (WebAssign, (WA)), online quiz(WA), discussion quiz, discussion homework, and exams for a total of 410 points in accordance with the distribution below.

Class Participation: All students are required to purchase a H-ITT clicker from the campus bookstore (a used one works well) and to register their clicker; any other forms involving smart phones will not be supported. Starting September 3, students will be required to have their clickers in class in order to participate in lectures. Students will be asked questions to test their understanding of class materials and their responses will be graded and recorded. There will be no makeups for missed clicker questions however only 80% of the collected points will be counted towards the grade to compensate for absences, mechanical failures, etc. A formula on how to scale the points collected is in the Resource section in Sakai.

Online Homework and Quiz: Students are require to purchase access for online assignment with WebAssign. This service costs about \$50 and students receive an electronic version of the

textbook. During the course of the semester, online assignments will be assigned and must be completed within the given time interval. The procedure for purchasing and registering is outlined in a document located in the resources section in Sakai.

Discussion Homework (5pts/set): Every student is scheduled to attend a weekly discussion session. Two homework sets will be collected in discussion throughout the semester to ensure that the students have a concise mathematics understanding of the material and be able to write out complete, logical, algebraic solution. This written homework is based on the written solution you have completed for the online homework. You must keep a good compilation of the completed work you have done for your online homework assignment and bring the complete set to your discussion section. It's not sufficient to just write down the answers, a clear description of algebraic steps logically and correctly written out is needed to secure the grades.

Discussion Quizzes(5 pts/set): After the first week of the semester, 8 quizzes will be given in the discussions throughout the semester to ensure that the students is keeping current with lecture topics. You must be present at the beginning of the class in order to take the quiz. There will be no makeups for missed quizzes, however, two lowest quiz grades will be dropped at the end of the semester to compensate for occasional/emergency absences, etc.

Exams: During the semester we will have three unit exams and a mandatory comprehensive final. The unit exams consist of multiple choice problems and free response problems; the final exam consists solely of multiple choice questions. The Unit exams will begin at 8:30 in the evening and will be on Tuesday, September 30, Tuesday, October 28th, Monday, December 1st; exam locations will be announcement during the course of the semester. The final exam is on Saturday morning, December 13th from 10AM till noon. The exams must be taken at the assigned time and location. You will not be allowed to enter the room to take the exam if you are more than 10 minutes late to the exam, and you may not leave the exam within the first 15 minutes.
