Course Description and Objectives

The sequence of courses STA 2023-3024 provides students with a firm foundation in the basics of applied statistical methods. The prerequisite for this course is STA 2023, which covered data collection, graphical and numerical summaries, probability, and an introduction to statistical inference.

The course begins with a review of STA 2023 and then focuses on the following four topics:

- 1. Analysis of Variance to compare three or more population means.
- 2. Simple Linear Regression and Multiple Regression to predict a quantitative response.

3. Analysis of Two-Way Tables to study the relationship between two categorical variables.

4. Nonparametric Statistics that do not require a normal distribution of the response variable.

Materials:

- 1. **Course Notes**. The course notes are available for purchase from Target Copy on University Ave. These incomplete notes are general outlines of topics that will be filled in during lecture. <u>Students should bring these notes with them to **every** lecture.</u>
- 2. Textbook. There is NO REQUIRED textbook for this class.
- 3. **Statistical Software.** We will use the statistical computer package, Minitab, for homework. You can access it from UF Apps for free through <u>http://info.apps.ufl.edu/</u> or on any PC computer labs on campus (find locations and hours at: <u>https://labs.at.ufl.edu/</u>).

Homework Assignments - There will be six homework assignments to be handed in throughout the summer session. Homework assignments will be due each week on Thursday in class, and are not to be submitted via email. Students must show work to receive credit. Because the solutions will be posted on Canvas the same day that they are to be handed in, late assignments will not be accepted.

These assignments will consist of several computational problems. Students may work together but must hand in their own solution. Directly copying another student's work is not allowed. Should copying occur, both the student who copied work from another student and the student who gave material to be copied will automatically receive a zero for the assignment. Penalty for violation of this Policy can also be extended to include failure of the course and University disciplinary action.

Quizzes – We will have a 15-minute quiz at the beginning of class each week on **Wednesday** for a total of 6 quizzes. Each quiz will consist of 5 multiple choice problems which are similar in nature to exam questions. Students are allowed to bring a calculator (graphing or scientific). In addition, a formula sheet and the relevant statistical tables will be provided.

Exams - There will be two exams given **in class**. The second exam is not cumulative. Each exam will consist of 25 multiple choice questions. All students must bring the following materials to the exams: student ID or picture ID, a calculator, and pencils.

In case of conflict or illness, if a student is unable to take an exam at the scheduled time, they must contact the instructor **prior to the exam time**, for any arrangements to be made for a makeup. Each case will be reviewed individually. Valid and detailed documentation is a prerequisite under such extenuating circumstances. **Makeup exams will be 50% short answer.** A grade of zero is the minimum punishment for any type of dishonesty on an exam.
