Textbook: Understanding Analysis by Stephen Abbott (2nd Ed, Springer, 2015). The **TI-Nspire CX CAS** calculator is required. A manual is found at http://education.ti.com/en/us/guidebook/search/ti-nspire.

Goal: The student will become familiar with the techniques of advanced analysis, proofs of the main results, and some applications.

Syllabus: This course is a two-semester introduction to the basic techniques of analysis. The material to be covered in the two semesters follows: set theory, the real number system, metric spaces, continuous functions, differentiation, Riemann integration, interchange of limit operations, the fixed point theory, implicit function theorem, solutions of differential equations, partial differentiation, multiple integrals.

In addition to covering the principles of analysis and the main proofs, the course will also introduce some applications and methods of calculating using the theory. For this purpose the students are required to have a **TI-Nspire CX CAS** calculator. No other calculator is acceptable. Programs will be available online to download. The calculator will be used for examples in class and needs to be available for class exams.

The material to be covered this semester is the following.

Week 9-10	Differential equations
Week 12-14	Higher dimensional calculus
Week 15-16	Review
