Course content: We will discuss the following topics: homotopy and the fundamental group; simplicial, singular, and cellular homology; and as time allows, begin a discussion of cohomology. Along the way we will learn a lot of homological algebra.

Grading: A necessary condition for success in this class is diligent completion of homework. I will assign homework regularly and take it up every two weeks or so; this counts 50% of your grade. A mid-term exam will count 20%, and there will also be a final exam worth 30%. A standard 10-point grading scale applies.
