AREAS OF SPECIALIZATION

Comparative Politics with an emphasis on the legislatures, political parties and party systems of the European Union, individual countries of Europe and the American Congress.

Political Methodology including game theory, spatial modeling, rational choice and statistical analysis.

SELECTION OF COURSES TAUGHT

Introduction to Comparative Politics (Lower Division Undergraduate). An introduction to comparative politics using political theory and case studies, including democratic, democratizing & non-democratic regimes.

The Politics and Institutions of the European Union (Upper Division Undergraduate). A survey of the history, politics and institutions of the European Union including the major theories of integration and current issues such as monetary union and eastern enlargement.

The Political History of Italy (Upper Division-Undergraduate). A survey of the development of Italian politics from the end of the renaissance through the present focusing particularly on the battle for unification, the rise of fascism after the failure of the liberal state and the reforms of the 1990's.

The Comparative Politics and Institutions of Post-Industrial Societies (Upper Division Undergraduate). A theoretical introduction to the differences between various types of political institutions found in modern industrialized democracies and the impact they have on policy outputs. Examples are drawn from most of Western Europe, the United States and Japan.

European Politics (Upper Division Undergraduate). An historical and institutional comparison of Eastern and Western Europe with a focus on the different developmental paths (both political and economic) that each region took up to the modern era. Particular attention is paid to the role/impact of natural resources, the industrial revolution, nationalism and the democratization process on the evolution of state development.

Current Events in European Union Politics (Upper Division Undergraduate). An intensive survey of key events in EU development including eastern enlargement, the development of an independent military task force (Common European Security and Defense Policy) and EU-NATO relations, developments in the Transatlantic relationship and the "Future of Europe" debate (convention & development of constitution).

The Political System of the European Union (Graduate). An intensive course on the political institutions and policy process of the European Union with a focus on the comparative character of the policy process and its implications for the EU as a whole.

Formal Theory and Democratic Political Institutions (Graduate). The course is an introductory survey of formal theory (game theory, spatial modeling) based on extensive reading and analysis of core readings/articles in the literature with a focus on political institutions and their effects on policy production.).

Politics, Institutions and the Policy Process in Western Europe (Graduate). A survey course on the political institutions of numerous Western European Countries (as well as the EU). Particular focus on the impact of “consensus” versus “majoritarian” type political systems on regime stability, policy output and “democratic satisfaction.” Primarily seminar type course with very heavy reading and a high level of in class participation.

Introduction to Formal Theory (Graduate) A basic introduction to the methods, approaches and assumptions of formal theory including spatial modeling, game theory and rational choice theory. The course covers the core concepts in formal theory through lectures, presentations and problem sets. Topics include: normal form, extensive form, 1 & 2 dimensional models, voting games, and Bayesian updating among others.

The European Union in Comparative Perspective (Graduate). This course examines the political development and institutions of the European Union using standard tools of comparative politics with a focus on institutions and institutional development. By moving away from *sui generis* claims about the EU the course permits a deeper understanding of the EU today while facilitating some predictions about its future development.

The European Union in the World (Upper Division Undergraduate Study Abroad). This course investigates the role of the European Union as an international actor focusing on the impact of the character of the EU itself, the impact of its economic policies, enlargement and neighborhood strategies and foreign policy initiatives. The course is taught to a broad spectrum of international students in Brussels and incorporates an analysis of perception of the EU as a global actor both within and outside of the EU itself.

Amie Kreppel is a Jean Monnet Chair (*ad personam*) and the founding Director of the Jean Monnet Center of Excellence (JMCE) at the University of Florida (2007- present). She also served as the founding Director of the University of Florida's Title VI funded Center for European Studies (CES) from 2003-2011. She is an Associate Professor in the Department of Political Science. Dr. Kreppel has written extensively on the political institutions of Europe in general and the European Union and Italy more specifically. Her publications include a book on the Development of the European Parliament and Supranational Party System, published by Cambridge University Press (2002) as well as articles in a wide variety of journals including *Comparative Political Studies*, *the British Journal of Political Research*, *European Union Politics*, *the European Journal of Political Research*, *Political Research Quarterly*, *the Journal of European Public Policy* and *the Journal of Common Market Studies*. Dr. Kreppel is a founding member of the transatlantic European Parliament Research Group (EPRG) and was a Public Policy Scholar at the Woodrow Wilson International Center for Scholars in Washington DC. In addition, she has served as international visiting faculty at the *Université Louis Pasteur (ULP)*, Strasbourg, France, *Institut für Höhere Studien (Institute for Advanced Studies)* Vienna, Austria, and the *l'Institut d'Etudes Européennes, Université Libre Bruxelles (ULB)*, Brussels Belgium and will be a visiting professor at the LUISS Guido Carli University in Rome in Spring 2014. In spring 2011 she was a visiting Fernand Braudel Senior Fellow at the European University Institute (EUI) in Italy. From April 2011- April 2013 she served as the President of the European Union Studies Association (EUSA). She is currently Co-Editor of the Italian Political Science Review, President of the Conference Group on Italian Politics and sits on the steering committee of the European Consortia for Political Research Standing Group on the European Union (ECPR-SGEU). She has received numerous grants to pursue research and program development related to Europe and the European Union including a MacArthur Fellowship, a grant from the Institute on Global Conflict and Cooperation, two internal research grants from the University of Florida and Title VIa (UISFLP) and Title VI (NRC) grants from the United States Department of Education, as well as several grants from the European Union.
