Course Description:

First-order ordinary differential equations, theory of linear ordinary differential equations, solution of linear ordinary differential equations with constant coefficients, the Laplace transform and its application to solving linear ordinary differential equations.

Textbook:

Fundamentals of Differential Equations (8th Edition) by Nagle, Saff, Snider.

Homework

Homework assignments for each section will be posted on my website. Homework will not be collected or graded, however keeping up with the homework is crucial in order to be successful in this class. Students should complete the homework assignment for a given section within 2 days of that section being covered in class.

<u>Exams</u>

There will be three in-class midterm exams and a cumulative final exam. Each exam will count for 25% of a student's final grade in the course.
