PROGRAM

The purpose of this program is to educate students about African American culture, history, and politics in the city of Paris, France. You will write papers, hear lectures, view films, and visit several historic sites of relevance to African Americans in Paris. You will also learn about the many African Americans who left the U.S. and traveled to France to escape American racism. Students will visit several historic sites in Paris where these individuals lived and worked. This program will be of interest to anyone interested in learning about Black people's experiences in Paris.

LOCATION

The city of Paris has been referred to as the "City of Light" because of its beauty and culture, but for many African Americans it was the "City of Refuge." Many black artists, writers, entertainers and others moved from the U.S. to Paris as a way to escape blatant legalized American segregation.

EXCURSIONS

You will visit historic institutions and sites in and around the city of Paris such as the Assemblee' National (Parliament of Paris), Eiffel Tower, the predominantly African Goutte d'Or neighborhood, the Montmarte district, Richard Wright's home in Normandy, and the Versailles Palace, and take a cruise of the River Seine.

You will share rooms in a very nice hotel in the heart of Paris.


