COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course is intended to help students read Greek more confidently and prepare them for advanced study of the language. Students will learn translation strategies and improve their knowledge of ancient Greek grammar and vocabulary by reading passages that illustrate different prose styles and rhetorical techniques. In class, students will go over the required readings, beginning with Plato's *Apology*, read passages at sight, and review Greek syntax and morphology.

REQUIRED TEXTS (available online and at local bookstores)

Plato's *Apology*. *The Bryn Mawr Commentary and the Helms edition are recommended*

REQUIREMENTS

- 10% Participation in daily class meetings. Three unexcused absences.
- 90% Four midterm examinations:
 - Exam 1 (15%) on September 9
 - Exam 2 (25%) on October 7
 - Exam 3 (25%) on November 9
 - Exam 4 (25%) on December 7
